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PROGRAM NOTES

Down in the Valley



If you don't love me, Love whom you please

"Down in the Valley" is one of those songs that everyone seems to know but no one knows for sure where or when it originated. It may have been brought over to Kentucky in the early 19th century by Irish settlers – indeed, the tune is almost identical to the Irish folk song known as the "Connemara Cradle Song." The lyrics exist in several versions, as with most folk songs. Over the years, dozens of recording artists have included "Down in the Valley" in their albums, including Burl Ives, Earl Scruggs, Eddy Arnold and even Connie Francis. Our arrangement, which starts softly and builds to a rich harmonic climax before fading away as quietly as it began, is by George Mead, organist and choirmaster at New York's Trinity Church for 27 years and one of New York's most celebrated choral conductors. Mead died in 1994 at the age of 96.

No Time

The camp meeting song called "No Time" is usually heard in combination with another song of that genre, "Rise, Oh Fathers." And that is the grouping we present here. Together, the two songs make for a very powerful yet delicate piece. The lyrics look forward to "the end of time," "that morning," when "we will hear the angels singing." There will be "no time to tarry" then, as we'll be "on our journey home." The singers bid a sad good-bye to mothers, fathers, sisters, and other family members. Sad, yet joyful, because the singers "really do believe" that they will "meet Him in the sky." Our arrangement is by Susan Brumfield, Professor of Music Education at Texas Tech University. Dr. Brumfield is known especially for her work with children's choruses and the several children's songbooks she has edited. She has also researched the connection between American folk tunes and their roots in British traditional music.
