PROGRAM NOTES

Jewett (Amazing Grace)



"Shout, shout for glory!" Religious fervor overtakes a camp meeting. The dog in the right foreground seems caught up in it, although the two on the left have something else in mind.

John Newton, an English sailor with a mouth so foul he was actually put off ships on which he served, "got religion" one storm-tossed night when the sailor who took his place on deck at change of watch was washed overboard. Mending his ways, Newton entered seminary and was ordained an Anglican priest in 1764. He wrote "Amazing Grace" in 1773 but it was not published until 1779. The hymn is usually sung to the tune *New Britain;* here, however, we sing it to the tune *Jewett*, written by Civil War soldier Richard F.M. Mann. No fewer than fifteen hymns by Mann appear in the shape note hymnal *The Sacred Harp*. In true camp song tradition, the *Jewett* version of "Amazing Grace" adds a refrain not found in the *New Britain* version: "Shout, shout for glory!" Shape note tunes are often sung by people – how shall we say – unschooled in the art of singing. We try to imitate that distinctive raw, bright sound in our rendition of this old hymn.

Wade in the Water

Musicologists have cataloged over 6000 African-American spirituals. Composer Antonin Dvořák famously said that themes found in spirituals were "as great as anything Beethoven ever wrote" and could serve as "the foundation of a serious and original school of composition" in America. Dvořák kept a notebook of tunes his student and friend Harry T. Burleigh, grandson of a former slave, sang to him, and wrote his Ninth Symphony, which he subtitled "From the New World," to prove his point. "Wade in the Water" was inspired by the story of Moses leading the Israelites through the Red Sea (Exodus 14) and of Jesus curing an invalid at the pool of Bethesda (John 5:1-14). It dates back to pre-Civil War times although it didn't appear in print until 1901. It was said to be a favorite of abolitionist Harriet Tubman, who used it (as many spirituals were used) as a coded instruction manual for how runaway slaves might escape capture: "Wade in the water" so that bloodhounds might not follow your scent. Our arrangement by Mark Hayes features blues nuances and swinging vocals that move to a climactic finish.
